



Our Program

The PGY1 Residency program at Saint Francis Hospital was established in July of 2000 and was awarded ASHP accreditation in the fall of 2002.

Over the past twenty years, we have expanded our program to three positions and offer a variety of clinical learning experiences providing a customized, and well-rounded resident experience.

Our residents receive robust acute care experience servicing areas such as our Level 1 Trauma Center, medical, surgical, cardiac, and neonatal intensive care areas. With ambulatory care offerings in both primary and specialty care, residents have the opportunity to practice at the top of their licensure.

Our institution and our department have always been committed to advancing pharmacy services and cutting-edge technology.

Saint Francis Hospital was the first institution in the state of Connecticut to implement a full-time pharmacist in the Emergency Department, and the first in the state to establish a PGY2 Ambulatory Care Pharmacy Residency Program.

As a major teaching hospital, we maintain collaborative relationships with local schools of pharmacy. Our residents have the opportunity to work with a variety of pharmacy learners and as part of interdisciplinary teaching teams.

Program Structure

Our PGY1 pharmacy residency program builds on Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions. Upon completing our program, residents will:

- Be eligible for board certification
- Be eligible for PGY2 residency training
- Gain experience precepting APPE students
- Obtain a Teaching Certificate through the University of Connecticut School of Pharmacy

Learning Experience schedules are built based on resident practice interests and preceptor availability.
