Diverse array of patients with a focus on cardiac populations (most commonly MI, Chest Pain and Arrhythmias) Common procedures that you may see include cardioversions, cardiac catheterizations, PPM/AICD placements and ablations. The unit also functions as an overflow MICA (intermediate care) unit as well as a Level 1 Stroke unit.

Prior Experience required/suggested

No prior experience is required – an interest in cardiac nursing is suggested

Orientation

- Average length of orientation is 14 weeks for RNs and 6 weeks for CNAs
- · ACLS certification required within 1 year of hire as an RN
- Shadowing experiences for RNs during orientation include cath lab, stress lab, EP lab, cardiac OR and a partial shift with the on-unit Monitor Tech
